Netball Coaching for Beginners

This is the country's most popular course for those who are new to delivering Netball sessions in schools, or who have not done so for a few years. Over 1,000 teachers have attended this event, over the years. No previous experience of playing or teaching the game is necessary, though most participants have a basic understanding. Umpiring School Netball

Most teachers of Netball are required to umpire school matches, often in front of an audience of critical parents. This can be stressful for the novice, or inexperienced, umpire. Relatively recent rule changes have made this more challenging. This is a course to help teachers gain confidence that they can create a safe and positive environment for both players and spectators. It will ensure that teachers are familiar with the Rules, but also how the school game should be managed and scored. This course consists of classroom based learning and practical application. It also considers how the Rules can be applied sensitively to young players and lower ability games, to allow play to flow, and maximise player enjoyment and development.

Beginners' Rugby Coaching and Refereeing (15-a-side)

Coaching and refereeing school Rugby has become more demanding in recent years. The need to ensure safety has never been more prominent, and research reveals that coach education is a major factor in injury reduction. This is a course for teachers and coaches involved in delivering 15-a-side Rugby coaching, and refereeing matches and practices. It will also provide a refresher for teachers adjusting their coaching to accommodate new tackle laws. It focuses on the practicalities of organising a coaching session, and introduces a range of techniques and ways to practise them. The emphasis is on modern techniques and simple, imaginative practices.

The afternoon is devoted to refereeing the game at school level. This focuses not only on the basic laws, but also the practicalities for the school referee of creating a safe and even contest and using specific methods of communication to ensure that the match day experience is safe and enjoyable for all involved.

The 7-a-side Hockey game, played at Under 13 and below, provides an introduction to the game for most young players. This is the stage at which a sound foundation of basic skills and game understanding is established. Although many of the techniques are similar to the full game, the tactical implications of a smaller pitch demand an alternative approach. The abbreviated game also allows opportunities to introduce tactical dimensions that will continue into the 11 a side game, such as strategies for long corners, hits around the circle and the self pass.

Hockey Coaching and Umpiring for Beginners

This long-running course is aimed at teachers who are new to coaching and umpiring hockey, or who have not been involved in the school game for a few years. It provides an introduction to modern coaching techniques, as well as tactical considerations for team play. Coaches will become confident that they can develop individual players, in addition to preparing school teams for competition. Ten conditioned, training games are introduced, along with guidance on structuring school sessions for both the 7 and 11 a-side versions of the game.


